Welcome back to Term 2 Session 2016/2017. We envisage an extremely busy term with Christmas approaching and we will keep you updated as we move along.

Curriculum Update

We continue to make steady progress undertaking the development outlined in the School Improvement Plan.

Priority 1 - Raise attainment in Writing

Throughout Term 1 teaching staff worked enthusiastically to review and update practice in relation to; learning and teaching, assessment and moderation for the purpose of further raising attainment in writing skills for all children. This involved careful consideration of the new bench marks set out by the Scottish Government.



Priority 1 - Raising attainment in Numeracy and Mathematics



Throughout Term 2 we will be embarking on 'Glasgow Counts' to ensure that learning and teaching in Numeracy and Mathematics across the school is in keeping with current research and practice for the purpose of raising attainment.

Priority 2 - The Curriculum

In addition, we will also be reviewing aspects of whole school overviews to ensure continued progression in; Social Subjects and Health and Wellbeing.

Primary 1 and Primary 2 teachers continue to develop the use of play in learning. We have recently developed and resourced the open area adjacent to Primary 1 and Primary 2 classrooms where children have the opportunity to further explore play and creativity.



As a Community of Faith and Learning, we continue our faith journey using the guidance set out in the documents - This is Our Faith and God's Loving Plan.

Space - The Nest

Last School Session we started the process of creating a 'soft space' for children who require either time away from the classroom or a time which focuses specifically on their individual needs in a variety of forms.

The Parent Council greatly supported this initiative by - sourcing donations from Anderson Maguire and Community Choice Care and by providing expertise in relation to ideas regarding resources.



On behalf of the school community we thank Anderson Maguire and Community Choice Care for their kind donations which will go towards purchasing further resources to complete this very worthwhile and much needed space. Thank-you also to the Parent Council for their effort in helping us take this development forward.

Vandalism

During the summer holiday period and subsequently over a number of weekends our school has been hit hard by vandals who have destroyed; part of the Nursery Class mud kitchen, outdoor learning resources, smashed bottles, damaged bins, wrote graffiti on the wall at the side of the school and ripped out plants etc. As you can imagine we are all very upset that our school should be targeted in this way.

We have been in contact with Police Scotland and Community Security in the hope of getting this stopped.

In true St Fillan's style parents of children from the Nursery Class assembled a parents' group to discuss how they could help repair the damage to the mud kitchen. In addition, the Smiddy who have greatly supported the school over the years immediately donated money to help with repairs.

On behalf of the whole school community we say a 'huge' thank-you to the parents involved and the Smiddy for their outstanding support.

Health Promoting / Improving School

At St Fillan's Primary School and Nursery Class we strive to make children aware of the importance of healthy living through the Health and Wellbeing aspect of Curriculum for Excellence and through a positive school ethos which promotes health improvement.

Recently, we have observed that a number of children are bringing in a significant amount of sticky sweets, chocolate, fizzy drinks and juice containing high amounts of sugar and other additives for playtime snacks and in lunch boxes.

Research has firmly established that when children consume high levels of sugar and other additives not only does it result in obesity and increased levels of dental decay and other conditions - it has a definite effect on learning, behaviour and how children perform generally in school.

Please can I ask parents/carers to support us in being a **Health Promoting School** by ensuring that children bring <u>water</u> to drink during school hours and snacks/packed lunches promote healthy choices.

Winter Approaching

Once again we ask that parents/carers please label items of clothing. The lost property bags are full of blazers, jackets, jumpers, cardigans and items of PE kits which all add up to a lot money. Please check that your child has their belongings when they arrive home, especially now that the hats, scarves and gloves will start to be worn as the weather gets colder. Children at our school need to take more responsibility for their personal belongings as they can be very careless!

Reporting to Parents Evening

Will take place on Thursday 10th November 2016 3.30-8.30pm. Parents/Carers of P6 and P7 pupils are invited to bring their child to the reporting session in order that they can be part of the discussion - *if they wish to do so.*
