At present, we continue to make steady progress through the School Improvement Plan 2016/2017. As previously stated raising attainment in writing is one of our main targets for this year and this has resulted in a thorough evaluation and review of practice. It is envisaged that the development undertaken will impact on standards and pupil attainment in writing over time.

In February, we will begin development in numeracy and mathematics for the purpose of raising standards, attainment and achievement. Class Teachers will engage in professional reflection, dialogue and debate in relation to research which is designed to be a useful starting point for the purpose of ensuring learning and teaching methodology enables all children to achieve their potential and as a result raises attainment for all.

We will update you on our progress at the end of Term 4.



World of Work Day - Parents in Learning

In Term 4, on Friday 28th April, we will be having our annual '*World of Work Event*' as part of the children's Broad General Education Experience. This event aims to help children make connections with what they are learning at present and the skills required for the future in the work place. The best way to achieve this is by presenting opportunities for children to meet with real people, doing real jobs, and have opportunities to discuss and ask questions about different aspects of the workplace and specific job skills.

In school session 2015/2016, this event was a great success due to significant parental involvement together with the involvement of other businesses.
