Dear Parents/Carers

Term 4 is upon us already. I hope that you had a wonderful break and all your children have settled back into the routine after our fortnight holiday. We are now entering an even busier time of year with a lot of events planned which we will keep you updated about, including the Easter celebrations and the rest of events planned throughout the term

Curriculum Update

Throughout term four we will evaluate the areas of our School Improvement plan that we have implemented during the session and collaboratively plan our steps for next year.

Priority 1 - Raise attainment in Literacy

This term we are evaluating the work we have undertaken on developing our writing across the stages and assessing the impact of the work we have undertaken. In particular we will be looking at the impact of the methodology training we received during our February inservice day. We will look at ways of implementing this further across all stages in school focusing on the content, pedagogy and assessment.



Priority 2 - Raising attainment in Numeracy and Mathematics



This term we will evaluate the 'Glasgow Counts' methodologies across the school to ensure that it continues to have a positive impact on learning and teaching in Numeracy and Mathematics. We are continuing to focus in particular on problem solving and working with concrete materials to aid mathematical concept development.

Priority 3 - Child protection policies and procedures

During our Inservice days and throughout the term we will be further monitoring and evaluating the work we have covered during the session on our Child Protection Policies in line with National Guidance. We will continue to ensure we follow GIRFEC, SHANARRI, UNRC, Children's Charter Equality Act 2010 guidance.



Priority 4 - Digital Learning Our staff continue to develop ways of incorporating digital learning into different areas of the curriculum. There has been work done across the school in using 'Green Screen' Technology and iMovie to enhance Literacy, Eco schools, cultural diversity and Social Studies.

Priority with wider school focus

Play Pedagogy has been further developed throughout our P1 classes. We have continued to liaise with our partner May Geddes who gave staff informative feedback and ideas for developing further.



Sacraments of First Holy Communion and Confirmation

Following the wonderful celebration of the Sacrament of First Reconciliation for our P3 children during March we are now looking forward to our P4 children celebrating the Sacrament of First Holy Communion during May and our P7 children celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation in June.

An information evening for the parents of children taking part in the P7 Confirmation will take place on Thursday 9th May at 7.00pm in the Church Hall at Christ the King.

We wish the children every good wish and blessing as they continue their faith journey. We also remind you of our Easter celebrations this week and next. Stations of the Cross will take place in school on Thursday 18th of April. Fr. Peter will celebrate mass with us on Thursday 25th of April during Easter week.

Cultural Diversity Week

Following the success of last year's event we are planning our Cultural Diversity week for Next week 23^{rd} - 26^{th} of April. We look forward to celebrating the wonderful school community through some food tasting as well as Dance Taster sessions and meeting some representatives from our Partner the Refugee Survival Trust. We will have a food tasting event celebrating the wide and varied culture of St Fillan's on **Friday the 26**th of **April**.

<u>Please ensure</u> - When entering the school at any time of the day, everyone must walk through the <u>main pedestrian gates</u> and <u>NOT</u> through the gates at the car park. We are increasingly concerned by the number of parents who are still walking children through the car park - especially parents of children in the Nursery Class. Everyone's safety is of paramount importance.

The gates at the car park are closed at <u>8.50am - 9.05am and 2.50pm-3.10pm</u> to ensure that there are no moving vehicles while the children are entering and leaving school premises. Please support us in keeping everyone safe. Please also refrain from coming through the gates into the playground at the back of the school.
