Dear Parents/Carers

Everyone at St Fillan's Primary School and Nursery Class wish all our parents and families a 'Very Happy Easter' filled with many blessings. The children have settled well after the holiday and are working hard to achieve their potential in preparation for their next stage.



As we approach the end of school session 2016/2017 we evaluate all the development work we have undertaken and identify next steps for 2017/2018. As previously stated raising attainment in writing is one of our main targets for this year and this has resulted in a thorough evaluation and review of practice. The school's Standards and Quality Report which will be published at the end of the session will provide parents with information regarding the impact made on attainment.

In February, we began to introduce the theory, methodology and strategies which encapsulate the Glasgow Counts initiative for the purpose of raising standards, attainment and achievement in numeracy and mathematics. This will continue to be a priority for School Improvement Plan 2017/2018.

Our three Principal Teachers have been taking forward their remits which include:

- > Health and Wellbeing (Mrs Gibb)
- Audit and review of progression in learning and teaching -Science, Social Subjects, Health and Wellbeing and Technologies (Mrs Adams)
- > Eco and Outdoor Learning (Mrs McAvoy)

We have identified aspects of the above for further development in 2017/2018.

At Parents' Evening on 30th March, we provided all our parents with a copy of our 'Pupil Equity Funding Proposal' on how we planned to spend the £66,000 allocated to our school. Bids for all schools were sent to Maureen McKenna, Executive Director of Education to approve. The development highlighted in the bid will also form part of the school's raising attainment priorities for 2017/2018.

All going well we are excited about the prospect of being able to further meet the needs of those children who require additional support for learning with the additional resources identified. We will keep everyone informed of our progress.

Seasons for Growth - Information Reminder

Seasons for Growth is a programme for children, young people or adults who have experienced significant change or loss.



Seasons for Growth is based on the belief that change, loss and grief are a normal and valuable part of life. It aims to produce a sense of resilience, personal growth and acceptance of change in people's lives.

The children and young people's programme deals with change, loss and grief associated with death, family breakdown, or any other form of separation or circumstances.
