Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome back to Term 2 Session 2017/2018. We envisage an extremely busy term with Christmas approaching and we will keep you updated as we move along.

Curriculum Update

We continue to make steady progress undertaking the developments outlined in the School Improvement Plan.

Priority 1 - Raise attainment in Literacy

Throughout Term 1 teaching staff have undertaken professional development in relation to the introduction of new resources and teaching methodology to support raising attainment in Literacy and English. Our main focus is - reading comprehension, correct use of grammar and improving spelling skills.



Priority 2 - Raising attainment in Numeracy and Mathematics



Throughout Term 2 we will continue to develop 'Glasgow Counts' to ensure that learning and teaching in Numeracy and Mathematics across the school is in keeping with current research and practice for the purpose of raising attainment. We have purchased a variety of resources to support this development.

Priority 3 - Raising attainment in Health and Wellbeing



On INSET Day 3, teaching staff revisited Health and Wellbeing Policies to ensure all aspects of the Health and Wellbeing Curriculum are being included in planning for learning and teaching. Our focus for School Session 2017/2018 is Food Technology and we have identified and purchased necessary resources to support learning and teaching and children's experiences. Staff also refreshed their 'Respect Me' training taking a close look at the impact of pupils' behaviour. This is particularly relevant leading up to Anti-Bullying Week 2017 (13-17 November). The final staff session looked at 'All Behaviour is Communication' and how this links to the principles of nurture.

Priority 5 Religious and Moral Education

As a Community of Faith and Learning, we continue our faith journey using the guidance set out in the documents - This is Our Faith and God's Loving Plan.





From November 2017 - November 2018 we will be marking 100 years since the 1918 Education (Scotland) Act together with Catholic schools across Scotland. In learning about the historic significance of this unique act, our children will be exploring the Past, Present and Future of Catholic schools.

Health Promoting / Improving School

At St Fillan's Primary School and Nursery Class we strive to make children aware of the importance of healthy living through the Health and Wellbeing aspect of Curriculum for Excellence and through a positive school ethos which promotes health improvement.



Recently, we have observed that a number of children are bringing in a significant amount of sticky sweets, chocolate and juice containing high amounts of sugar and other additives for playtime snacks and in lunch boxes.

Research has firmly established that when children consume high levels of sugar and other additives not only does it result in obesity and increased levels of dental decay and other conditions - it has a definite effect on learning, behaviour and how children perform generally in school.

Please can I ask parents/carers to support us in being a **Health Promoting School** by ensuring that children bring <u>water</u> to drink during school hours and snacks/packed lunches promote healthy choices.

Winter Approaching

Once again we ask that parents/carers label items of clothing. The lost property bags are once again full of blazers, jackets, jumpers, cardigans and items of PE kits which all adds up to a lot of money. Please check that your child has their belongings when they arrive home, especially now that the hats, scarves and gloves will start to be worn as the weather gets colder. Children at our school need to take more responsibility for their personal belongings as they can be rather careless!

Reporting to Parents Evening

Will take place on Thursday 9^{th} November 2017 3.30-8.30pm. Parents/Carers of P6 and P7 pupils are invited to bring their child to the reporting session in order that they can be part of the discussion - if they wish to do so.

Every family should now have received one appointment per child. Each parent/carer is given an allocated time which the Class Teacher plans in relation to the number of children in the class. Should you require additional time to discuss any matter then we will gladly arrange a further appointment at a later date.

At present they are busy getting organised for Christmas parties which the children look forward to attending.
