Moving forward, we have taken the decision to stop posting any information about our pupils on X/Twitter. We will continue to focus on more direct forms of communication, such as newsletters, emails and updates on our school website.

Local Parking in Crompton Avenue

A letter from Very Rev. David J Canon Wallace:

Many people who are neurodiverse find it difficult to attend and take part in Sunday Mass. Often the sensory environment is too stimulating and sometimes people and families feel that they are not welcome, or judged, especially if they find it difficult to sit still or be quiet or if their behaviour is different from others in the congregation. This situation may apply to your family.

At St. Andrew's Cathedral we hope to offer an adapted Mass that will better meet the needs of the neurodiverse members of our community and their families. We hope it would be a stigma-free and less stimulating environment in which everyone would feel accepted for who they are. Initially we would plan to have one Mass a month, starting at Easter.

To help our planning we would first like to listen to people who might be interested in coming to this Mass and to their families. We will have a meeting in the Cathedral on Sunday 9 February at 2.30 and we would like to welcome you if you are interested or have something to offer that would help our planning.
