Local Parking in Crompton Avenue

We have continued to appeal to Parents/Carers (and family/friends who you ask to support you at arrival/dismissal times), to adhere to the 'School Safe' parking regulations. This week we had the Police attend the school to address the increasing number of vehicles that are continuing to park on Crompton Avenue outside the school. We have been made aware that some Parents are continuing to park at the very end of Crompton Avenue and Carmunnock Road - where you cannot be seen by school staff and/or our JRSO Committee. I have also tried to engage directly with parents and carers to implore people to adhere to our request not to park anywhere outside the school in the Safer Streets Area. Additionally, recent changes in terms and conditions on various social media platforms have raised concerns regarding safety, privacy and the overall well-being of our pupils and families. We believe it is essential to prioritise these values in our communication efforts.

Moving forward, we have taken the decision to stop posting any information about our pupils on X/Twitter. We will continue to focus on more direct forms of communication, such as newsletters, emails and updates on our school website.

We have also joined Bluesky. It is a very similar platform to the early days of X/Twitter. The App is free and is available on Google Play, Apple's App Store etc. We kindly ask that you give consideration to downloading Bluesky and follow us @stfillansps.bsky.social

A letter from Very Rev. David J Canon Wallace:

Many people who are neurodiverse find it difficult to attend and take part in Sunday Mass. Often the sensory environment is too stimulating and sometimes people and families feel that they are not welcome, or judged, especially if they find it difficult to sit still or be quiet or if their behaviour is different from others in the congregation. This situation may apply to your family.

At St. Andrew's Cathedral we hope to offer an adapted Mass that will better meet the needs of the neurodiverse members of our community and their families. We hope it would be a stigma-free and less stimulating environment in which everyone would feel accepted for who they are. Initially we would plan to have one Mass a month, starting at Easter.

To help our planning we would first like to listen to people who might be interested in coming to this Mass and to their families. We will have a meeting in the Cathedral on Sunday 9 February at 2.30 and we would like to welcome you if you are interested or have something to offer that would help our planning. If you are unable to make this meeting or would prefer to speak to someone privately
