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Friday Update 20th November 2020

Dear Parents/Carers,

Following the governmental announcement of the elevation of restrictions in the Glasgow area, I wanted to thank you all for supporting the school and for your understanding of the challenges that we have in trying to ensure school is as normal as is practical despite the continuing significant changes that we have to implement.

Tier 4 Government restrictions

As you are aware Glasgow is one of 11 Local Authorities placed into Level 4 of the current COVID-19 restrictions. Please see the link to the letter issued by the Education Directorate on our school website. https://tinyurl.com/yykvn247

This also provides information and guidance on restrictions on meeting others indoors and outdoors, shared parenting, going into some else's home and extended households. As a GCC school it is our responsibility to ensure that all families, staff and the whole school community are adhering to the most p to date government guidelines

Tier 4 restrictions are significant in terms of the impact on our school. Our priority continues to be the safeguarding of the health and safety of all the children and the staff. This is of paramount importance. We have to limit the amount of movement within the school for staff in terms of delivering messages or speaking to individual children. In order to help reduce the risk of virus transmission we would ask that you do not contact the office to deliver a message to your child unless it is an emergency. Messages should not be left regarding packed lunches, water bottles etc. This will assist us greatly in helping safeguard all our staff and our clerical support team in particular.

Even under the current restrictions we are trying to ensure that your child experiences a 'normal' school day. However, please understand that a significant amount of work is being undertaken by all staff to ensure that this is possible.

As we are now in Tier 4 it is important that we ensure that pick up and drop off is a s efficient as possible and the minimum amount of contact should be made with other households.

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PE in schools

The advisory sub-group has indicated that advice on physical education in schools should remain broadly in line with advice in the community going forwards, in order to ensure consistency and better support compliance. Guidelines on physical education will therefore be reviewed and updated regularly to ensure appropriate alignment. As we are in Level 4, PE will revert back to outdoors from Monday the 23rd of November.

COVID related absences

If your child or a member of your household develops symptoms of COVID 19 and goes for a COVID test it is essential that this information is communicated directly with the school so that we can update our records accordingly. Please arrange to collect your child from school if this situation arises during the school day. If a child displays any of the symptoms of COVID please do not send them to school. It is also essential that any siblings who attend school remain at home until the test results are confirmed as negative.

Due to current circumstances, please phone the school office to report <u>all absences both COVID and non-COVID.</u>

Interim Reports

Your child's Interim Report will be sent to you by the end of next week. The reports will be quarantined for the requisite period of time before being sent home.

Holiday Meal entitlement

The Scottish Government have provided Local Authorities additional funding for children **currently in receipt of Free School Meals (FSM)** to receive a food payment as part of the Holiday Hunger Programme over the following school holidays:

- Christmas 2020
- February 2021 Mid Term Break
- Easter 2021

The payment will be made in **December 2020** and will cover all **3 holiday periods** noted above.

Please Note: Only children eligible for Free school Meals (FSM) will be entitled to this payment.

As all **P1 to P4** pupils automatically receive Free School Meals as part of a national and local initiative it is important to note that **only** those families in receipt of a <u>qualifying benefit</u> are eligible for this additional payment. The Local Authority have undertaken an exercise to identify and 'auto-entitle' P1-4 pupils who are eligible via qualifying benefits but who have not yet made an application for Free School Meals via the CBS Grants Team. This auto-entitlement will continue <u>until the pupil reaches the end of P4</u> at which point parent/carers must make an application via the FSM application process.

IMPORTANT: All payments will be made by bank transfer therefore if parents have not previously provided CBS Grants Team with bank details, i.e. for Footwear & Clothing Grants, they will now need to provide these details no later than **14th December 2020** via the online Enquiry Form at: https://www.glasgow.gov.uk/schoolsandlearning
