Safety in the Playground/School Gate

Can I please remind parents, grandparents and other carers that Glasgow City Council's policy on dogs stipulates that dogs are not permitted in the school grounds at any point? Despite this being mentioned in the last couple of newsletters, there have still been instances of people bringing their dogs to the playground. We really appreciate that everyone adheres to this directive and keeps their dog(s) outside of our school grounds. We would also appreciate if adults please do not stand directly at the gate with a dog. You'll appreciate this is a tight space; some pupils with a fear of dogs could become quite anxious trying to leave school with a dog in such close

proximity. Best practice would be to arrange a collection point away from the main school gate.

Safer Streets



We continue to promote our participation in Glasgow City Council's Safer Streets campaign. The following traffic restrictions are in place around the school Monday to Friday. There is no traffic permitted between 8.30 and 9.15 and 2.45 -3.30. We have contacted our friends in the Community Police to support us and issue tickets to vehicles passing through this area.

The street outside the school has parking restrictions in place at these times also. We ask that Parents/Carers do not park on the pavement on Crompton Avenue outside the school. If a relative is collecting your child, please pass this important information onto them. This ensures that children can cross safely at the crossing point with the crossing patroller. Blue badge holders can park on school grounds. Please contact the school office if you wish to access.

School Entrance guidance

Please do not use the school car park gate at any point in the school day. This is a service entrance for authorised vehicles only.

Pedestrians are not permitted to enter through this gateway at any time. Families walking though the car park gates to access breakfast club/After School Care should use the other pedestrian gate near the main office when dropping off/collecting your child/children. We have continued to see Parents/Carers using this despite repeatedly requesting people not to do so. Thank you for your understanding and co-operation in this important health and safety request.

Allergies and medicine update

If you have informed us that your child may require medication, you must complete paperwork; forms are available at our school office. Completed paperwork should be accompanied with your child's medication e.g. inhalers, antihistamines etc. stored inside a small transparent tub with a lid.

We are aware that some children may have the status of their allergy or medical conditions amended over the summer break. Please ensure that we have the most up to date information and medication with regard to your child's/children's health.

Important information

Significant works are currently being undertaken by Scottish Water in Cathcart.

Roadworks will be in place in various phases as the project progresses, which will include the use of temporary traffic lights, road closures and some access and parking restrictions.

If you drive to school, please consider parking away from Crompton Avenue to help reduce congestion. Thank you.

The Church of Scotland is someway along in discussions to unite Cathcart Old Parish Church with Cathcart Trinity Church, with the union set to be ratified in November 2024. As a result, Cathcart Old Parish Church will go on the market and be sold to the highest bidder. However, we believe the church and its adjoining community hall are too important to lose. That's why we've formed the Cathcart Community Hub, a new Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) SC 053394. Our goal is to seek funding and raise the resources needed to purchase the church and hall for our community, ensuring these vital spaces remain a part of local life for generations to come.

Our Aspiration: A Community-Led Future

The **Cathcart Community Hub SCIO** is dedicated to safeguarding and enhancing the church and community hall by putting them at the heart of our neighbourhood. We aim to:

- Prevent the loss of the church to private interests, ensuring it remains a community asset
- > Transform the church and hall into vibrant, multi-purpose spaces that meet the needs of everyone in the community
- Preserve our local heritage, maintaining the historical significance of Cathcart Old Parish Church

Our Vision for the Church and Community Hall

We envision a future where the church and hall continue to serve our community as:

- A gathering place for local groups, clubs, and activities
- A venue for cultural, educational, and social events
- ➤ A community centre providing services and support for all ages and abilities from babies to seniors

By keeping these spaces in community ownership, we can ensure they remain accessible to everyone and continue to be used in ways that benefit our whole neighbourhood including ensuring we can continue to meet the needs of those who are most vulnerable in our community.

Community Ownership: By purchasing the church and hall, we ensure they stay in the hands of local people.

Sustainability: As a SCIO, we can access grants and funding to maintain and improve the buildings.
