P1 Photographs

It is imperative that you let us know as soon as possible if you **do not** want your child to be in this year's class photographs.

P1B and P1c have PE timetabled for that day. For their photographs, all P1s should attend school on Tuesday 3rd September in full school uniform inc. school tie.

Collection and dismissal arrangements

A reminder of the arrangements for collection at the end of the school day: 3pm: P1 Parents/Carers to collect their child from the infant yard at 3pm. Please exit the playground as soon as you collect your child.

3.05pm: The trial of P2 pupils being collected form the infant playground has proven to be successful. We will continue with Parents/Carers collecting P2s at 3/05 daily in the front playground. Please do not enter the playground until 3.05pm and exit the playground as soon as you collect your child.

P3 Parents/Carers to collect from the area in front of the school. Please have a pre-agreed meeting place known to your child/children. This helps alleviate any anxiety a child may feel if they cannot find who is collecting them at dismissal time. All P1-3 pupils must be collected by a responsible adult.

P4-7 Parents/Carers of children from P4 upwards should arrange a mutually agreed safe arrangements.

Can we please ask that Parents/Carers don't congregate in large groups directly at the school gate especially at the end of the day as the children can find it difficult to see their parents/carers when they are being dismissed.

Please remind your child that if they cannot find the adult who is collecting them at the end of the day, they should return to the staff at the school gate or return to the school office. "If there is no one there, come in to the chair". We will reinforce this message at assemblies.

Free school meals and uniforms

Safer Streets



You will be aware that the school is part of Glasgow City Council's Safer Streets campaign. The following traffic restrictions are in place around the school Monday to Friday. There is no traffic permitted between 8.30 and 9.15 and 2.45 -3.30. We have contacted our friends in the Community Police to support us and issue tickets to vehicles passing through this area.

The street outside the school has parking restrictions in place at these times also. We ask that parents carers do not park on the pavement on Crompton Avenue outside the school. This ensures that children can cross safely at the crossing point with the crossing patroller. Blue badge holders can park on school grounds. School Entrance guidance

<u>Please do not access the school through the main car park gate at any point in the school day as this is a service entrance for authorised vehicles only.</u> Pedestrians are not permitted to enter through this gateway (especially for breakfast club) and should use the other pedestrian gate near the main office. Thank you for your understanding and co-operation in this important health and safety request.

Allergies update and medicine

Please ensure the school has the most up to date information and medication with regard to your child/ren's allergies. Forms for this are available at the school office. We are aware that some children may have the status of their allergy or medical conditions amended since the start of the summer. Please send you child's inhaler and any other medication to the school immediately.



Social Value

This work was completed through the company's commitment to social value, a group volunteering scheme that allows staff to offer their time to support local community projects and impact positive change.

Important information

We have been informed by Scottish Water of <u>significant works</u> due to be undertaken in Cathcart. *Each pupil has a note in his/her school bag today about the planed works*.

Work will begin on Monday 26th August, and is expected to last approximately 24 weeks.

Roadworks will be in place in various phases as the project progresses, which will include the use of temporary traffic lights, road closures, and some access and parking restriction

Nut free School

Some pupils in St. Fillan's have a severe allergy to nuts. For those with a nut allergy it is not just eating nuts that can cause a severe reaction. Just being touched on the skin or smelling the breath of someone who has had nuts or a product containing nuts can trigger anaphylactic shock which can cause breathing and swallowing difficulties. 20% of severe allergic reactions to food happen whilst a child is at school. (Model Policy for Allergy at School.)

While we recognise that we cannot fully guarantee a nut-free zone, as staff cannot monitor all lunches and snacks brought in from home, we ask for full support from Parents/Carers to ensure products in lunch boxes or brought into the school as snacks do not contain nuts.

For example:


Peanut butter cakes
Sauces that contain nuts

Peanut butter sandwiches
Chocolate spreads
Chocolate bars containing nuts e.g. Snickers, Reese's, Kinder snacks Happy hippo / Bueno
Cereal bars
Some granola bars
Cakes that contain nuts
Biscuits / cookies that contain nuts



This list is not exhaustive, so please check the packaging of products closely. We appreciate that this is an additional thing to check but we know that you will recognise the importance of such a request.

Bouldering @ The Climbing Academy 8yrs +

Through the kind support of The Climbing Academy, Active Schools Staff are delighted to offer the below partnership programme for our pupils. Bouldering is a form of climbing usually practised on small rock boulders, or at indoor walls. Bouldering is carried out at lower heights than roped climbing. The 'boulderer' is able to climb down or jump down (so no ropes and harnesses are required). All boulder walls have specially designed crash mats installed under the climbing surfaces. This partnership programme with Active Schools Glasgow offers not-for-profit session where the fee required covers costs. The course is aimed at those aged 8 years and over and is suitable for anyone who would like to try climbing for the first time. The class provides an opportunity for youngsters to develop their climbing in a fun yet structured fashion.

Running weekly on Wednesdays 4:30-5:30pm
